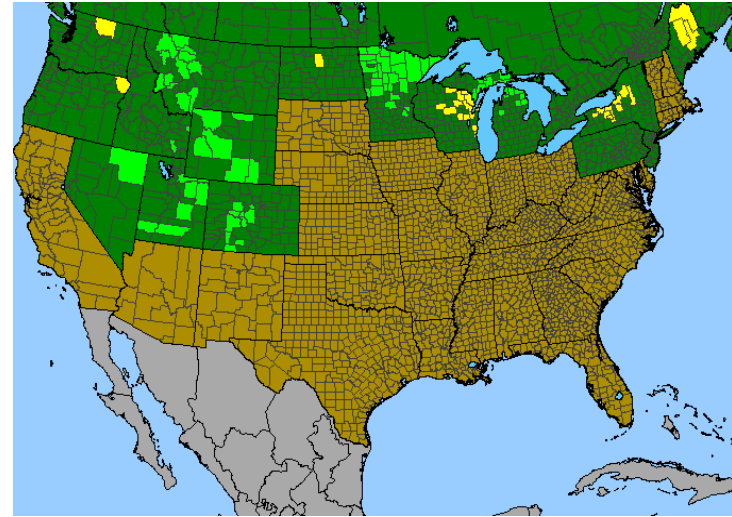

Habitat Wet peaty ground, usually in openings in coniferous swamps and conifer-hardwood stands, less often in poor fens, boggy swales (flarks) and alder thickets, also subalpine meadows, tundra, outwash gravel and seepage areas, usually on calcareous substrates (FNA).

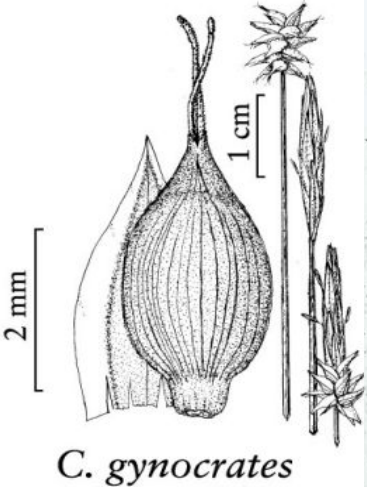
Estimated number of native extant occurrences (0) 0 – 1 (4)

Factors that increase conservation concern

The occurrence was in the vicinity of 100 miles from the nearest known locality in NY.

Known from Pennsylvania from a single collection at GH collected by John Goldie at "Pittsburg" between 1819 and 1822. Presumably Goldie actually found the plant in the glaciated northwestern part of the state.
